Delta Chi's 1st "Bowlathon" Bowling Tournament for the Jimmy V Foundation



The Tri-State Chapter of the Delta Chi Fraternity is always improving and striving to raise more money for the Jimmy V Foundation. With new installation of the MTI Center on Trine University's campus, a bowling fundraiser in the new bowling alley would be the perfect opportunity to raise money while having fun. The hype for a 5K run began to lose interest within the chapter, so a change in fundraising opportunities was the best option to revitalize brothers' enthusiasm. The First Annual "Bowl For a Cure" fundraiser will roll on March 15th 2019.

The Bowling Fundraiser will consist of teams of four bowlers in six lanes for three hours. Have an engineer do the math, and we project over \$700 gross from entry fees. Generous local companies have agreed to cater food for all competing bowlers including pizza, donuts, cookies, and chips with salsa. A silent auction consisting of 10 bundles of donated goods will begin a few weeks before the event and finally commence at the conclusion of bowling. We currently have 8 sponsors and 12 companies donating silent auction items or catered food. As we continue to close on sponsorships and donations, we would like to thank the Angola community for all the support. With your help, our math major predicts about \$2500 total for direct deposit to the V Foundation!

Our chapter relies on the spring fundraiser every year to generate the majority of our funds donated to the Jimmy V Foundation. "The V Foundation" is our sole philanthropic organization appointed by International Delta Chi in 2006. The foundation is named for Jim Valvano, who started it himself in 1993. Across the nation, The Delta Chi Fraternity has raised over \$1 million dollars for this cause over the past 12 years. As a chapter, we strive to reach our pledge of \$10,000 every convention year with incentive to achieve Top Ten Donor status at the International Convention. Lastly, donations of all shapes and sizes are graciously accepted. Therefore, if you do not plan on attending the incredible 50th year celebration, you can show your support by donating toward the cure for cancer.
